HONORING THE AVM PARNTERS – PART III Sandra Day O'Connor USAF JRROTC Program



The AVM ceremonies are always special because the Sandra Day O'Connor H.S. USAF Junior ROTC (AFJROTC) stand proud. Their leaders MSGT Badey (USAF, Ret.) and COL Clocksin (USAF, Ret.) ensure the polite and professional cadets are up for the challenge each year.

The mission of the AFJROTC is to develop citizens of character dedicated to serving their nation and community. The Sandra Day O'Connor AFJROTC average over 4000 hours of community service yearly.

The AFJROTC four-year program is led by the senior cadets. The curriculum is made of Aerospace Science and Leadership lessons that focus on making positive choices and decision making; developing selfdiscipline; being accountable for actions; developing effective leadership and followership; understanding effective communication; developing life skill lessons; developing a physical fitness regime.

The program also provides extracurricular activities to include air rifle marksmanship, robotics, drones, remote controlled aircraft, archery tag and flight simulator training.

Amassing over 5100 community service hours last year, the cadets volunteer activities, include, but are not limited to:

- Packing emergency food boxes at St. Mary's Food Bank.
- Supporting the annual Anthem Veterans Day parade and ceremony.
- Supporting the Ironman and Rock and Roll Marathon events by setting up/breaking down and supplying water stations.
- Providing color guards and saber team lines for community events and district-wide graduations at State Farm Stadium.
- Supporting the National Alliance for Mental Illness (NAMI) walk by setting up/breaking down, keeping water stations stocked and cleanup.
