



Outdoor Fire Prevention

- Dispose of lighted cigarettes properly – never dispose of them on the ground or side of the road.
- Remove dead and piled-up vegetation and dispose of it properly.
- Stack firewood away from structures, fences or anything else that may be combustible.
- Never park an overheated vehicle in dry brush, important when pulling off the road or highway. Keep the underside of your car off the roadside brush as the hot car may catch the brush on fire.
- Trees can be a ladder for fire if their branches are too close to grills or fire pits. Be sure to trim tree branches that hang over view/block fences or bushes that crawl through iron fences to prevent the spread of fire.
- Top trees only when necessary as topping creates too many lower branches that can increase the fire danger.
- Control the height of ground vegetation, pull all weeds and mow the grass often.
- Provide enough water to keep plants healthy and green. Keep irrigation systems in good working order.
- Store and use flammable liquids properly.
