HONOR FLAG TO FLY ABOVE ANTHEM VETERANS MEMORIAL DURING MAY CEREMONY

Anthem, Ariz. – An iconic image of American patriotism makes its Anthem debut this May, as the Honor Flag will be raised at the Anthem Veterans Memorial (AVM) during the annual Memorial Day ceremony, May 30.

The Honor Flag, first placed on the fallen World Trade Center towers following the events of the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attack on New York City, has traveled the country and beyond, honoring all those who have fallen in the line of duty while protecting and serving our nation and its residents. The flag has flown at Ground Zero, U.S. bases in the Middle East and aboard Atlantis, NASA's final space shuttle.

The Honor Flag has become a symbol of honor, rich in history, and inspired a renewed spirit of patriotism as it pays tribute to the men and women who have answered the call of duty and gone before us.

This year's Memorial Day ceremony, hosted by the Anthem Community Council, AVM Support Team and Daisy Mountain Veterans, will open with the presentation of the Honor Flag by the color guards of the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office, the Daisy Mountain Fire Department, the City of Phoenix Police Department and the City of Phoenix Fire Department.

The ceremony begins at 10 a.m. May 30 at the AVM, 41703 N. Gavilan Peak Pkwy.
